


New 'consumer' cigarette

CARLO BONOMI'S new 35ft. Cigarette, which he used to win the Bahamas '500' on June 7, is pictured above. This was Carlos' fourth win in the World Offshore Championship series this year and he is well on his way to obtaining an unprecedented second consecutive world championship crown.

This brand new 35ft. long, 8ft. beam, Cigarette clocked almost 90 mph in prerace trials and is claimed by the designer cum builder, Don Aronow, to be the largest trailerable powerboat so far built.

After the performance at the Bahamas '500', Aronow announced that the 90 mph



racing hull is going into production as a 60 mph consumer version to be known as the Awesome 35. Don says that his latest high performance hull will be styled with a European Riviera flair, as can be seen from the initial plans which I reproduce above.

He seems to have done it again, this time with a 35-footer designed skinny like the hot hulls of old, including the original *Cigarette*, a cargo boat of the Prohibition era. Don Aronow's new Awesome 35 is his latest Cigarette design, available in both sport and racing versions with a variety of power options. The slower Awesomes (60 mph) are posh performers arranged for overnight cruising and in-the-water entertainments but adaptable to production-class racing. The fast versions (90 mph), like Dr. Carlo Bonomi's *Dry Martini* which won this year's Bahamas 500, are full-tilt offshore racing machines with a heritage of six solid years as the boats to beat in the international ocean-racing circuit. The Awesome 35 is also the largest trailerable powerboat in all of human history.
